

Shrine of Madonna delle Grazie - step cammino di Sant'Agostino

The building was built in 13th century and it has a form of a latin cross and a pronaos made up of 4 columns. Inside the Shrine we can find an old coffered ceiling and 3 paintings of '700, which represent S. Carlo, S. Giuseppe and S. Giuliana Vergine Martire. The Shrine is the place where the pilgrims of Cammino di Sant'Agostino start their journey. Cammino di Sant'Agostino is divided into 14 days of travel.

Cycle route starts along the Villoresi canal, crossing Nova Milanese and Muggio' centers. It's unpaved until Nova M. and then it becomes asphalted.

Vertua Masolo Villa - Arti del Fuoco Collection



This is a very beautiful Villa in early twentieth-century Liberty style. It was owned by Vertua - Masolo families. The Villa has become the permanent home of Arti del Fuoco Collection.

The Collection consists of contemporary works of painting on porcelain, ceramics, enamel on metal and vitro fusion. At present there are 350 works of art by Italian and foreign artists. The works come from all over the world such as Italy, Europe, Japan Thailand, USA and Australia.

Casati Villa

Casati Villa was built in 15th century and it was the summer residence of Casati, a rich Guelph noble family from Milan. This house gave hospitality to cardinal cousins, Carlo and Federico Borromeo.

Its type derives from traditional models of baroque art and French draws.

Royal Villa of Monza

In 1777 Empress Maria Teresa of Austria ordered the construction of a summer residence for his son Ferdinand I, Governor of Lombardy. The task was entrusted to Piermarini, author of the Teatro alla Scala.

The interior consists of 600 rooms connected to each other. The gardens of Royal Villa, were initially designed as formal gardens and later, were redesigned as landscaped gardens with a pond and small temple. On the west side is placed a rose garden which includes about 500 kinds of roses. It is considered by botanists one of the most prestigious rose gardens of Europe.
